Major Upgrade by August 1, 1999

We are working hard on a major upgrade to services on
the Project.

In the last month, we have added several new casualty database
searches, with more to come in the days ahead.

The most important upgrade will allow visitors to
automatically add additions to unit pages. Up to now, Ted has
had to do this work manually, an impossible task due
to the volume of daily unit page additions.

The upgrade will also allow visitors to create a personal

password to allow changes to personal Guestbook, Unit Additions, and Remembrance pages.

We will send a special announcement when the updates are live.

Remembrance

Our Remembrance section is another success story. We have had over 1500 additions to the casualty databases. These additions by family and friends are often heartbreaking and poignant.

Our goal is to have a Remembrance entry for every serviceman lost in the war zone.

Databases

We have recently added the Defense Prisoner of War/Missing Persons PMKOR POW/MIA database, the Korean War Veterans Memorial Honor Roll database, the George Matta Memorial POW Database, and information obtained by Mr. Marty O'Brien on non-battle casualties.
